

Rule Challenges & Interpretations to Bylaw 1 (ISCA Class Rules)

<u>Challenge Record Number:</u>	7 (Digital Cut Sail Numbers)
<u>Date of Challenge:</u>	June 23, 2015
<u>Challenger:</u>	Rich Chapman
<u>Challenge:</u>	Digital (square) cut numbers are legal to use on sails
<u>Applicable Rules:</u>	3.6.5 “For sails purchased after 1 st January, 2015, the sail numbers shall comply with RRS G.1. For all other sails, the numbers shall comply with RRS G.1 or alternatively they shall comply with the following: Size & Shape: The numbers must be easy to read, rounded in shape”.
<u>Interpretation:</u>	Allowed
<u>Reasoning:</u>	Digital cut (non-rounded) numbers on the Sunfish sail do not pose a problem of clarity to race officials and effectively they are as legible as the benchmark Helvetica type face. This complies with RRS G.1. All sails may now use either digital cut or rounded numbers.
